

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) and the Puerto Rico Highway and Transportation Authority (PRHTA) hereby notify the general public, public and private providers of transportation services and federal, state and municipal governments the opportunity to review and provide comments of the proposed changes in the transportation component of the following documents:

- Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the fiscal years 2017-2020, Amendment #1
- Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for fiscal years 2017-2020, Amendment #1

These documents include projects to improve the transportation and highway systems in Puerto Rico, eligible to be financed with federal funds from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) under Sections 5307, 5310, 5311, 5337 y 5339; and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).


The Metropolitan Planning Organization is considering, by referendum, the proposed amendments to the transportation component of the TIPs, for the Urbanized Areas of San Juan, Aguadilla and Under 200,000 Population. The STIP must be approved by Federal Agencies.
